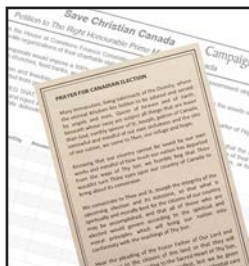

LENTEN WORSHIP SERVICES

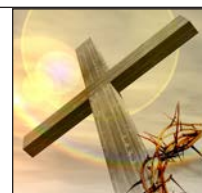

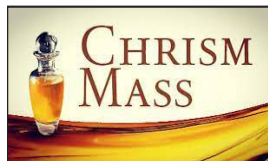
HOLY WEEK MINISTRIES
